A beautiful, haunting novel, in which nothing is as it seems, *Old God's Time* is about what we live through, what we live with, and what may survive of us.



AURORA VENTURINI was born in 1921 in La Plata, Argentina. She was an adviser to the Institute of the Child's Psychology and Re-education and studied psychology at the University of Paris. In 2007, she received the Página/12 New Novel Award for Las primas (Cousins). She died in 2015 in Buenos Aires, at the age of

ninety-two.

The English-language debut from an international star – nine iridescent, beguiling, witty and wonderous stories of dispossession and longing.

Both modern and historical, *Elsewhere* ranges from Dublin to London and Stockholm to China. Contemporary stories of isolation, the diasporic experience, homecoming, the internet and obsession are interlaced with those inspired by ancient texts and philosophy.

We meet a group of writers lounging on the edge of an earthquake disaster zone; a Mandarin ostracised from his old court, desperately trying to avoid a threat to his life; a woman who inexplicably loses her voice and the poet who steals her words; a couple who meet all too fleetingly at a cinema in Dublin. The collection crescendos towards its longest and final story, one of verve and power and dark humour, which follows the fortunes of one of Confucius's disciples.

Now in his seventies, Christopher Reid seeks to track down and commune with his much younger self by contriving a series of transtemporal encounters where the two may at last, conceivably, begin to understand each other. Most of the locations in this book, however, are the Britain of the 1950s and sixties – perhaps, at this distance in time, no less exotic. From an extraordinary poetic career, these poems offer intimate reflections on memory and the cost of human experience.

This volume draws on Andrew Motion's distinguished body of work and includes many new and previously uncollected poems. Certain preoccupations remain constant – an eye for the ways our lives are shaped by loss and an appetite to compensate for that deficit by paying close attention to the world. But Motion is also a roving spirit, a listener and watcher, and the forms and voices of the poems reflect this propensity, mostly using intimate lyric forms but sometimes adapting from direct speech and collaborating with documentary sources. Death is a haunting presence, but the deeply personal elegies here never lose sight of a broader contiguity. Motion's willingness to put himself in the place of others extends the collection's compass beyond the familial and enables him to address the vulnerabilities of the world at large.

ANDREW MOTION was UK Poet Laureate from 1999 to 2009 and is co-founder of the online Poetry Archive. In 2015 he was appointed Homewood Professor in the Arts at Johns Hopkins University; he lives in Baltimore.




The rise of nature writing as a cultural phenomenon is nothing new. Yet it has stirred questions relating to whose voices are privileged and heard in a space predominantly occupied by Western European traditions and writers.

In *Nature Matters*, poets Mona Arshi and Karen McCarthy Woolf seek to redress this imbalance. Their genre-defining anthology considers nature poetry from its historical roots to more recent flourishings, presenting how Black and Asian poets of past and present are decolonising this space. Committed to ecological enquiry and formal experiment, it explores fundamental themes such as climate crisis and the Anthropocene; protest and radical empathy; future ecologies; urban nature and the countryside; solitude and alienation.
